Environmental Advocacy Researcher

Summary:

Forests Forever, a San Francisco non-profit forest-protection organization, is beginning an exciting campaign to bring about needed changes to California's forest practice laws and regulations and requires a researcher to develop various advocacy materials.

Responsibilities:

Research and draft fact sheets, white papers and other documents needed to support forestry reform legislation, litigation, and other organizing activities.

Qualifications:

Direct experience in public policy research, especially research on resources statutes (land, water, air, wildlife), regulations, and case law. Ability to draft concise, well structured, thoroughly documented public policy analyses and related documents.

Status:

Part-time independent contractor position, on-site or off-site. Number of hours per month and length of assignment negotiable, depending on workload. Fee negotiable DOE. Reports to Operations Director.

Forests Forever was founded in 1989 and exists to defend and restore California's approximately 30 million acres of forest ecosystems. We coalesced around the campaign to save the Headwaters Forest, generating crucial public pressure that helped bring about the acquisition of the 7,500 acre Headwaters Preserve. We have since helped to stay logging in Mendocino County's Jackson State Forest, to pass the Oaks Woodlands Protection Act, to restore the Roadless Area Conservation Rule, and much more.
